HCC approved to launch bachelor's degree programs in 2023

HCC launches bachelor's degree programs in Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Robotics and in Healthcare Management in the fall semester.

The four -year programs are the college system's first bachelor's degrees. Approval for the programs was granted by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges, the accrediting organization for HCC and other colleges and universities across 14 states in the southern U.S.

The Bachelor of Applied Technology in AI and robotics is aimed at helping address a growing and critical need for skilled workers in a rapidly evolving technical field. AI has gained a foothold in a variety of industries, and graduates enter a profession with about 2,600 annual job openings in the Houston region. Such roles typically pay a median annual salary of \$97,200.

The Bachelor of Applied Science in healthcare management prepares students for career advancement or entry-level healthcare managerial positions. It enables working professionals to advance their careers by focusing on leadership skills, knowledge and healthcare management.

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics cites Medical and Health Services Managers as a growing field based on increased demand for healthcare services as "baby boomers" retire. Graduates of this program will enter a profession with 1,752 annual job openings in the Houston region with a median annual salary of \$64,200.

"The programs allow seniors opportunities to learn new skills, build on proficiencies or explore new interests," said Latrice Rideout, the Community Learning Program's director.

Courses include areas such as:

Become a Certified Nursing Assistant, tuition free

The HCC Community Learning Program at Houston Community College (HCC) and Dwyer Workforce Development have teamed up to train new Clinical Nursing Assistants for the region.

Under the Dwyer Scholar Apprenticeship program, up to 500 apprentices can attend HCC for free annually to earn CNA certificates.

The innovative program also aligns HCC and the State of Texas' commitment to achieving specific, measurable outcomes by serving more students, awarding credentials of value and developing the highly skilled workers that employers need.

Dwyer Workforce Development is a Maryland-based non-profit. It recently acquired 64 skilled nursing facilities in Texas, including a half-dozen in Houston and southeast Texas, and is converting them into nonprofits.

According to Texas Health Data, 349,000 nurses will be needed through 2032 but only 292,000 will be available. The apprenticeship program will help create a workforce pipeline to close that gap.

During the year-long apprenticeships, students receive advanced education, competitive wages, health benefits, and hands-on experience while working towards their licenses.

High schoolers earn associate degrees at HCC through dual-credit program

HCC provides area high school students the opportunity to earn college credit and high school credit concurrently while students are still in high school. What's more, the classes

Just this spring alone, hundreds of area high school students graduated from their schools while simultaneously earning an HCC associate degree.

The program is open to students who demonstrate college readiness through a State of Texas approved college-placement test can earn dual credit by taking approved college classes offered at high schools, HCC campuses, or online.

Such classes are taught by educators who mirror the profile of traditional college instructors using the same course rigor and classroom expectations.

HCC is partner of choice for offering dual credit to the Houston Independent School District (ISD); Spring Branch ISD, Stafford Municipal School District, Katy ISD, Alief ISD, Fort Bend ISD, as well as some private schools and charter schools.

The students begin their dual credit journey as freshmen and sophomores, focusing on workforce certificates or degrees in subjects such as computer programming, health information technology, histology, medical scribing and multidisciplinary studies.

The HCC Board of Trustees has waived tuition and fees for dual credit students for students living within taxing districts.
